**SPECIAL MEETING
MINUTES**

A special meeting of the West Mahanoy Township Board of Supervisors was held on the above date at 6:30 p.m. Meeting was called to order by Chairman Martin.

ROLL CALL: Paul Martin, Mickey Kayes, Anthony Gladski, Atty. James Amato, Chief Marvin Livergood and Michael Michalik.


Chair announced that the purpose of the special meeting was to hear comments from the public regarding the request for intermunicipal transfer of liquor license to the Auto Museum, LLC located at 2 Eleanor Avenue, Frackville PA 17931.

Attorney James Amato stated that the Township hand-delivered notice on 2/14/24 to all parcels that were located next to the above-mentioned property. Attorney Tom Campion was here on behalf of the Auto Museum and spoke about the intended use of the liquor license for special occasions and fundraisers.

Kayes made a motion to approve the transfer, seconded by Martin. Gladski abstained. Motion carried.

MINUTES

Meeting of the West Mahanoy Township Board of Supervisors was held on the above date at 7:00 p.m. Meeting was called to order by Chairman Martin.

ROLL CALL: Paul Martin, Mickey Kayes, Tony Gladski, Atty. James Amato, Michael Michalik, Chief Marvin Livergood, Donald Zimmerman and Jim Heffner.

PUBLIC: none

Minutes of January 3 meetings were approved by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

TREASURER REPORT: Michalik read off the report (copy attached)

FIRE REPORT: Martin gave report. William Penn F.C. handed in report for January, all is in good working condition.

POLICE REPORT: Livergood read off the report for the month of December 2023. He reported that there were 77 calls that were handled by the police department for the month. Chief stated the department handed out one traffic citation and there were eight non-traffic arrests that were made during the month. Police collected \$ 793.12 for the month for parking tickets, citations, and accident reports. The year-to-date collection for fines and reports is \$ 10570.42. Livergood read off the report for the month of January 2024. He reported that there were 33 calls that were handled by the police department for the month. Chief stated the department handed out two traffic citations, issued one quality of life ticket and there were eight non-traffic arrests that were made during the month. Police collected \$ 1420.58 for the month for parking tickets, citations, and accident reports. The year-to-date collection for fines and reports is \$1420.58.

CODE ENFORCEMENT REPORT: Heffner read a report for the month of January 2024. He stated that two occupancy, two maintenance, and two dumpster permits were issued. A total of 12 complaints were received and two tickets were issued.

ROAD CREW REPORT: Zimmerman updated his report stating that it's been busy past month with snow plowing and equipment maintenance.

All of the above reports were approved by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

CORRESPONDENCE: Chair read off letter from JD Eckman Inc. regarding a work start notification for the Route 61 Reconstruction Project.

OLD BUSINESS: Chair asked for a motion to approve Resolution # 2023-3, the appointment of sewage enforcement officers Robert Fugate, Bill McMullen, William Brior, and Douglass Kopp. Motion was made by Kayes to approve resolution, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

Chair asked for a motion to hire Mark Hysock as a full-time police officer at a rate of \$25.52 per hour with full benefits retroactively to 1/22/24. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

Chair asked to hire Matthew Bauer as a part-time road worker on an as needed basis at his current rate of \$12.00 per hour. Bauer has worked for the township through the vocational rehabilitation program, but his contract has expired. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

Chair asked for a motion to appoint Joseph Reading, Altamont, as a member of the Zoning and Hearing Board. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

Chair asked for a motion to appoint Russell Moisko, Altamont, as a member of the Planning Commission for a three-year term. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

NEW BUSINESS: Chair asked for a motion to accept the resignation of employee #136 from the road crew as of 2/15/24. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

Chair asked for a motion to advertise for a full-time road worker with a CDL License. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

PUBLIC: Jules Stremba, Shenandoah Heights, asked the board about the ordinance concerning 20-ton trucks on township streets and not being enforced. Amato informed him that the township police cannot be everywhere, so if you see something please call the communication center's number for non-emergency at 570-462-1991. Stremba also voiced his displeasure about not being able to vote for the township supervisor because of a vacancy on the board.

Richard Stevens, William Penn, voiced his concern with the condition of the road off SR#54 entering the William Penn firehouse. There was some discussion between Supervisor Martin and Stevens concerning the ownership of this road.

Keith McCauley, Altamont, had some concerns with the plowing of snow on the road behind his house which is located at 215 N. Line Street. Zimmerman explained to him that it is a dirt road and cannot be plowed as well as asphalt streets. McCauley asked that they do a better job of maintaining this road.

Joe Beacher, Shenandoah Heights, voiced his concerns with his neighbor's property, he wanted to know if this property was zoned for commercial use. Heffner stated that he has been in touch with the owner of the property and is he is working on cleaning it up. He added that the property is zoned residential.

Meeting adjourned at 7:35 p.m. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski. Motion passes.
