MINUTES**

Meeting of the West Mahanoy Township Board of Supervisors was held on the above date at 7:00 p.m. Meeting was called to order by Chairman Martin.

ROLL CALL: Paul Martin, Mickey Kayes, Anthony Gladski, Atty. James Amato, Michael Michalik, Chief Marvin Livewood, Mark Pronio and Donald Zimmerman.

PUBLIC: none

The minutes of November 19, 2024, meeting was approved by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

TREASURER REPORT: Michalik read off the report. (copy attached)

FIRE REPORT: Gladski read off report. The Altamont F.C. and William Penn F.C. handed in report for the month of November.

POLICE REPORT: Livewood read off the report for the month of November. He reported that there were 115 calls that were handled by the police department for the month. Police stated that they issued 18 traffic citations, seven criminal arrests, and they had one non-traffic arrest during the month. There were also seven parking tickets issued by the department. Police collected \$ 446.38 for the month from parking tickets, citations, and accident reports. A total of \$14,151.54 was collected year to date.

CODE REPORT: Pronio read off report. He stated that they received a total of 31 calls during the month. The department issued three citations and sent out 22 rental registration requirement letters. Five occupancy permits and four certificates of disclosure for the month along with 33 rental registrations. Also, we are planning to meet with Girard Estate in the new year and continue ongoing discussions with progress made concerning the property located on 6 Industrial Road.

ROAD REPORT: Zimmermann read off report. He stated that they are having issues with people throwing snow back on the streets in the Heights. Martin added that this is illegal. Also, he encouraged residents to purchase property flares so that the plow driver knows where the edge of their property is located.

Motion to approve all reports were made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

OLD BUSINESS: Chair asked for a motion to approve the collective bargaining agreement between West Mahanoy Township and the United Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners of America Eastern Atlantic States Regional Council, Affiliate Local Union #43. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes. It is a three-year contract expiring December 31, 2027.

Chair asked for a motion to approve Ordinance 2024-5, compensation increase for newly elected supervisors. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes

Chair asked for a motion to approve the 2025 Final Budget. Budget is a balanced budget with both revenues and expenditure at \$2,059,120. Included within the budget are Resolution #2024-9 and #2024-10. Township mileage will remain the same. Sewer rates will increase by \$2 per month. Motion was made by Kayes to adopt 2025 Budget, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

NEW BUSINESS: Chair asked for a motion to allocate remaining American Recovery Funds (ARF) for the purchase of police equipment. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

Chair asked for a motion to approve the meeting dates and time for 2025. The Board will meet on the third Tuesday of each month at 7:00 p.m. except for January. The Reorganization meeting will take place on Monday, January 6 at 7:00 p.m. with regular monthly meeting to follow Motion to approve 2025 meeting dates were made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:18 p.m. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.
