MINUTES**

Meeting of the West Mahanoy Township Board of Supervisors was held on the above date at 7:00 p.m. Meeting was called to order by Chairman Martin.

ROLL CALL: Paul Martin, Mickey Kayes, Anthony Gladski, Atty. James Amato, Michael Michalik, Chief Marvin Livergood, and Mark Pronio.

PUBLIC: none

The minutes of January 6th and 15th meetings were approved by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

TREASURER REPORT: Michalik read off the report. (copy attached)

FIRE REPORT: Gladski read off the reports. The Altamont F.C. and William Penn F.C. handed in report for the month of January.

POLICE REPORT: Livergood read off the report for the month of December. He reported that there were 67 calls that were handled by the police department for the month. Police stated that they issued 13 traffic citations, made two criminal arrests, and they had one non-traffic arrest during the month. There were also two parking tickets issued by the department. Police collected \$ 170,24 for the month from parking tickets, citations, and accident reports. A total of \$14,321.78 was the total collected for the year. Livergood then read off the report for the month of January 2025. There were 107 calls that were handled by the Police Department. Police stated that they issued 13 citations, made one non-traffic arrest and issued two parking tickets for the month. \$600.65 was collected for fines and parking tickets for the month.

CODE REPORT: Pronio read off report. He stated that they received a total of 36 calls during the month and 34 of them were handled. He stated that he and Jim Heffner have been busy handling the situation of abandoned vehicles, currently a dozen have been towed, and they will continue to address the issue.

ROAD REPORT: Martin stated the past month has been rough on the road crew. We were a man down for a few weeks and even two men down for a few days. He stated they are doing the best they can and asks for the residents to be patient with them.

Motion to approve all of the reports were made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

OLD BUSINESS: Chair asked for a motion to approve / disapprove the intermunicipal transfer of liquor license to Frackville Stores Inc., located at 541 Altamont Blvd. Motion was made by Kayes to approve the sale, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

Chair asked for a motion to approve Resolution 2025-1, a resolution to support statewide LSA Grant application in the amount of \$ 100,000 for the police department. Motion to approve was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

Gladski stated improvements have been made at the Heights intersection.

Cahir asked for a motion to accept the resignation letter from Patrolman Mark Hysock. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

NEW BUSINESS: Chair asked for a motion to advertise for a full-time police officer. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

PUBLIC: none.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:14 p.m. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.
