MINUTES**

Meeting of the West Mahanoy Township Board of Supervisors was held on the above date at 7:00 p.m. Meeting was called to order by Chairman Martin.

**ROLL CALL:** Paul Martin, Mickey Kayes, Anthony Gladski, Atty. James Amato, Michael Michalik, O.I.C. Ted Buriak, Donald Zimmerman, and Mark Pronio.

**PUBLIC:** none

The minutes of April 15, 2025, were approved by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

**TREASURER REPORT:** Michalik read off the report. (copy attached)

**FIRE REPORT:** Gladski stated that none were received.

**POLICE REPORT:** Buriak read off the report for the month of April. He reported that there were 64 calls that were handled by the police department for the month. Buriak stated that they issued 19 traffic citations and made four criminal arrests during the month. They also issued eight parking tickets and three non-traffic citations. Police collected \$ 243.40 for the month from parking tickets, citations, and accident reports. A total of \$ \$1847.95 was collected for fines and parking tickets for the year.

**CODE REPORT:** Pronio read off report. There was a total of 48 calls, of which 44 were made during the month. Code had fourteen rental registration inspections, five occupancy permits, and one certificate of disclosure permit handled for the month. Several abandoned vehicles were towed, and this will continue due to the efforts of Jim Heffner and the police department.

**ROAD REPORT:** Zimmerman stated they will be preparing for the milling portion of the road program. Hopefully the hot asphalt portion will follow shortly.

Motion to approve all the reports were made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

**CORRESPONDENCE:** none

**OLD BUSINESS:** Chair asks for a motion to approve the sale of 1157 West Lloyd Street to Susan Daniels with a bid meeting the minimum requirements for resale of the County Demolition Program of \$3280.00. Motion was made to approve sale by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

Motion to hire Mark Melusky as a full-time road worker at a probationary starting rate of \$18.50 per hour with benefits if needed. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

Motion to hire Joshua Kayes as a seasonal road crew employee at a rate of \$12.00 per hour. Motion was made by Gladski seconded by Kayes, with all three voting yes.

Motion to hire Christian Diaz and Lois Torres-Daniel as seasonal road crew employees at a rate of \$12.00 per hour. Motion was made by Gladski, seconded by Kayes, with all three voting yes. Diaz is part of the OVR program.

Chair stated that back at the October meeting, the Supervisors approved conditionally the request From Keystone based on engineer review. Engineers have now reviewed and approved the plans for the Highway Occupancy Permit (HOP) of Keystone in the area of William Penn Fire Company (SR 54) as long as the Township is not the permittee, also not responsible for road maintenance, marking or signage and will not be held liable for any incidents that occur. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

**NEW BUSINESS:** Chair asked for a motion to accept the resignation of Mark Pronio as code enforcement officer effective May 30, 2025, due to ongoing health issues. Martin complimented him by saying that he taught me a lot. that we didn't know what a code officer really could do. now we do know. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes. Supervisors also thanked him for everything and wished him the best of health.

Chair asked for a motion to approve the Girard Estate demolition list which includes the following properties: 217, 219, 493, and 587 Mount Olive Blvd. Motion to approve was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

Chair asked for a motion to advertise for a code enforcement officer with some basic knowledge of code laws and a computer background. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

Chair announced that the uniform and non-uniform pension plan audits have been completed by the Auditor General Office and are in compliance.

**PUBLIC:** Joe Beacher asked about the no burning policy. He stated that people are burning up here in the heights.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:18 p.m. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.
