MINUTES

Meeting of the West Mahanoy Township Board of Supervisors was held on the above date at 7:00 p.m. Meeting was called to order by Chairman Martin.

ROLL CALL: Paul Martin, Mickey Kayes (via Phone), Anthony Gladski, Atty. James Amato, Michael Michalik, Chief Matt Williams, Donald Zimmerman, and Jim Hefner.

PUBLIC: none

The minutes of June June 17, 2025 were approved by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

TREASURER REPORT: Michalik read off the report. (copy attached)

FIRE REPORT: Gladski stated that Shenandoah Heights F.C. handed in a report for the months of March, April, May, and June.

POLICE REPORT: Williams read off the report for the month of June. He reported that there were fifty-nine calls that were managed by the police department for the month. Williams stated that they issued ten traffic citations and made two criminal arrests during the month. The Department also issued seven parking tickets and had five non-traffic citations, and one adult male arrested. Police collected \$ 615.39 for the month from parking tickets, citations, and accident reports. A total of \$2997.35 was collected for fines and parking tickets for the year.

CODE REPORT: Hefner read off report. The department managed one rental registration inspection, two occupancy permits, and had seven dumpster permits and fifteen maintenance permits issued.

ROAD REPORT: Zimmerman stated that paving work just about completed and now they rented the brush hog to cut some of the higher weeds around the township.

Motion to approve all the reports were made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

CORRESPONDENCE: Chair read off a letter from St Joseph the Worker's Parish requesting police presence and to have the alley (North Lotus) be closed for their annual block party on August 1 and August 2. Motion to approve their requests was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

OLD BUSINESS: Chair asked for a motion to advertise Ordinance 2025-1, amendment to Ordinance #2004-4 concerning noise disturbances. Motion to approve advertisement was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

Chair asked for a motion to retain the services of S3, LLC Consulting as code enforcement consultant as per agreement. Chair stated that the agreement was a \$50 per hour rate and \$250 per hearing. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

Chair asked for a motion to approve agreement of resolution and payment to Unifirst Corporation Contract #1661579 in the amount of \$ 3000.00. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

NEW BUSINESS: Chair asked for a motion to appoint to code enforcement officers as zoning officers. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

Chair asked for a motion to hire Brandon Gonzalez as full-time police patrolman at a starting rate of \$26.23 per hour with benefits. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

Chair introduced Gary Hess, Schuylkill County Commissioner, who presented Michael Michalik with a proclamation for over 30 years of service for West Mahanoy Township. Chair also presented Certificate of Recognition/ Appreciation to him from Senator David Argall's office and Representative Tim Twardzik's office along with a certificate of appreciation from the Board of Supervisors for his service to the Township. Michalik thanked them for their recognition.

PUBLIC: Joe Beacher complimented the Chief and his department that he has seen an improved presence of patrol in his area. Charles Lawson, Shenandoah Heights, also gave credit to the police department for responding to his complaint in a timely manner.

Ann Marie Wycheck asked the Chief how many officers are full-time and are part-time. Williams stated that there are three full-time and four part-time.

Meeting adjourned at 7:28 p.m. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.
