**17 AUG 25  
MINUTES**

Meeting of the West Mahanoy Township Board of Supervisors was held on the above date at 7:00 p.m. Meeting was called to order by Chairman Martin.

**ROLL CALL:** Paul Martin, Mickey Kayes, Anthony Gladski, Atty. James Amato, Michael Michalik, Chief Matt Williams, Donald Zimmerman, and Matthew Kropp.

**PUBLIC:** none

The minutes of July 15, 2025 were approved by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

**TREASURER REPORT:** Michalik read off the report. (copy attached)

**FIRE REPORT:** Gladski stated that Shenandoah Heights F.C. handed in a report for July and William Penn F.C. for the months of June and July.

**POLICE REPORT:** Williams read off the report for the month of July. He reported that there were fifty-one calls that were managed by the police department for the month. Williams stated that they issued 17 traffic citations and eight parking tickets and made two criminal arrests during the month. Police collected \$ 963.99 for the month from parking tickets, citations, and accident reports. A total of \$3961.34 was collected for fines and parking tickets for the year.

**CODE REPORT:** Kropp read off report. The department had 30 calls reported, 25 warnings were issued, and four citations. Two junk vehicles were towed.

**ROAD REPORT:** Zimmerman stated nothing to report.

Motion to approve all the reports were made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

**CORRESPONDENCE:** Chair stated that the township audit for 2024 was recently completed and filed with DCED. All went well.

**OLD BUSINESS:** Chair asked for a motion to approve Ordinance 2025-1, amendment to Ordinance #2004-4 concerning noise disturbances. Motion to approve was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

Chair asked for a motion to approve Resolution 2025-3. Adopting the 2025 Schuylkill County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

**NEW BUSINESS:** Chair asked for a motion to approve the Northern Schuylkill COG amendment amending the requirement total of meeting per year. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.


Chair stated that Mark Melusky, road crew worker, has completed his probationary period and he asked for a motion to increase his salary to \$18.00 per hour plus \$1.50 for his cdl license. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

**PUBLIC:** Charles Lawson, Shenandoah Heights, inquired about the ordinance prohibiting vehicle repair being done on township streets. Martin confirmed there was an ordinance, Chief Williams stated he will investigate his complaint.

Joe Beacher complained that his neighbors are located at 117/ 119 Schuylkill Avenue. He stated that they have no consideration for any of their neighbors. Lawson added that the residents at 115 Schuylkill Avenue have open fires while roasting a pig. Willaims stated that will patrol the area.

Helen Cocoa, Shenandoah Heights, complained about properties near her as well (which are the same ones mentioned earlier). She also asked about out-of-state vehicles parked without inspections and other nuisance violations.

Meeting adjourned at 7:38 p.m. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.
