PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

MINUTES**

Meeting of the West Mahanoy Township Board of Supervisors was held on the above date at 7:00 p.m. Meeting was called to order by Chairman Martin.

ROLL CALL: Paul Martin, Mickey Kayes, Anthony Gladski, Atty. James Amato, Michael Michalik, Chief Matthew Williams, Matt Kropp and Donald Zimmerman.

PUBLIC: none

Minutes of October 18, 2025, meeting was approved by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

TREASURER REPORT: Michalik read off the report. (copy attached)

FIRE REPORT: Gladski read off report. Altamont F.C. handed in a report for the months of July, August, September and October. William Penn handed in a report for the month of August.

POLICE REPORT: Williams read off the report for the month of October. He reported that there were 55 calls that were handled by the police department for the month. Police stated that they issued 15 traffic citations, one criminal arrest, and had two non-traffic arrests during the month. There were also five parking tickets issued by the department. Police collected \$943.24 for the month from parking tickets, citations, and accident reports. A total of \$6,025.90 was collected year to date. Martin added nothing but compliments he is hearing about the police department.

CODE REPORT: Kropp read off report. He stated that they received a total of ten calls during the month. The department issued one QoL ticket and five written warnings were sent out. He stated \$6000.00 was received from rental permits and inspections. Five vehicles were also towed. Martin commended Kropp for a job well done.

ROAD REPORT: Zimmerman read off report. The trucks are ready for the winter weather. Martin added that the Shenandoah Valley art class painted the snowplows for us recently. He wanted to publicly thank Shenandoah Valley and its students for a job well done.

Motion to approve all reports were made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

CORRESPONDENCE: none

OLD BUSINESS: Chair asked for a motion to approve, pending final review of our solicitors and engineer, the Improvements agreement and the Traffic Signal Agreement for the I-81 Logistics Project. Attorney Amato added that these are almost finalized and that the developers would be financially responsible. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

NEW BUSINESS: Chair asked for a motion to approve the investment of \$100,000 of general fund money into a three-month certificate of deposit with an interest rate of 3.21% with the First National Bank. This is retroactive to November 6. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

Chair stated that the 2026 tentative budget has been prepared and asked for a motion to reduce the mileage rate from 7.15 mils to 1.245 mils due to the County reassessment. Michalik explained that 2026 taxbase will remain the same with the new mileage rate. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes. Michalik explained that the budget is a balanced budget with both revenue and expenditures at \$ 2,372,600.00. Motion was made to approve the tentative budget for 2026 by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

Chair asked for a motion to advertise the 2026 tentative budget for final adoption at next month's meeting. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

Chair publicly thanked Representative Twardzik's office and PennDot for the quick response addressing the storm drain repair on Schuylkill Avenue.

Chair also recognized Chief Matt Williams and Matthew Kropp for the service to our country.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:21 p.m. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.
