MINUTES**

Meeting of the West Mahanoy Township Board of Supervisors was held on the above date at 7:00 p.m. Meeting was called to order by Chairman Martin.

ROLL CALL: Paul Martin, Mickey Kayes, Anthony Gladski, Atty. Rick Day, Michael Michalik, Chief Matthew Williams, Matt Kropp and Donald Zimmerman.

PUBLIC: none

Minutes of February 17, 2026, meeting was approved by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

TREASURER REPORT: Michalik read off the report. (copy attached)

FIRE REPORT: Gladski read off a report for February for the Shenandoah Heights Fire Co.

POLICE REPORT: Williams read off the report for the month of February. He reported that there were 44 calls that were handled by the police department for the month. Police stated that they issued four traffic citations, had two criminal arrests, eight non-traffic arrests and issued ten parking tickets during the month. Police collected \$1520.64 for the month from parking tickets, citations, and accident reports. A total of \$2129.70 was collected year to date.

CODE REPORT: Kropp read off report. He stated that they received a total of 10 calls during the month. The department issued ten written warnings and issued 0 tickets for the month. He stated \$1350.00 was received from rental, occupancy permits and inspections. One vehicle was towed.

ROAD REPORT: Zimmerman read off report. The road crew was working down a plow truck, hopefully it's fixed soon and operable.

Motion to approve all reports were made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

CORRESPONDENCE: Chair read off letter from Representative Tim Twardzik inviting staff and supervisors to a grant funding seminar on April 10. Martin stated that he along with members of our staff will be attending.

OLD BUSINESS: Chair asked for a motion to approve a memorandum of agreement between the Township and the United Brotherhood of Carpenters and Junior of America, EASRC, local affiliate Union #431. He explained this will include Matthew Kropp as part of the Union. Motion was made by Kayes to approve memorandum, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

NEW BUSINESS: Chair asked for a motion to adopt Resolution 2026-4, accepting the deeds and putting on record that the developer will post a bond to ensure that the improvements will be completed set forth on the exhibit attached. Attorney Bob Matta spoke to them about the Resolution in detail. Motion to adopt resolution was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

Chair asked for a motion to approve the following properties for demolition as part of the Girard Estate Annual Demolition Program: 16, 18, 20 Small Road; 493 Mt. Olive Blvd; and 16 Upper Road (garage stays) and 1194 and 1198 W. Center Street. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

Mickey Kayes wanted to publicly commend Pepper Martin for his efforts during the Aqua water crisis, he stated that he went above and beyond in his efforts. Martin added that there were no costs to the taxpayers as well.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:15 p.m. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.
