MINUTES**

Meeting of the West Mahanoy Township Board of Supervisors was held on the above date at 7:00 p.m. Meeting was called to order by Chairman Martin.

ROLL CALL: Paul Martin, Mickey Kayes, Anthony Gladski, Atty. Rick Day, Michael Michalik, Chief Matthew Williams, Matthew Kropp and Donald Zimmerman.

PUBLIC: none

Minutes of May 12, 2026, meeting was approved by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

TREASURER REPORT: Michalik read off the report. (copy attached) Martin stated that the Township audit has been completed and all is in compliance.

FIRE REPORT: none

POLICE REPORT: Williams read off the report for the month of May. He reported that there were 74 calls that were handled by the police department for the month. Police stated that they issued eight traffic citations, had four non-traffic arrests and issued three parking tickets during the month. They had two criminal arrests and four non-traffic arrests. Police collected \$ 284.78 for the month from parking tickets, citations, and accident reports. A total of \$3892.78 was collected year to date.

CODE REPORT: Kropp read off report. He stated that they received a total of 35 calls during the month. The department issued twelve citations with Magistrate and three tickets were issued. Five vehicles were towed. Kropp stated he would like to thank publicly Nick Miluski and Damien Bagley for taking upon themselves on cleaning up some of the dump areas within the Township. Martin added that property owners will be cited when it comes to dumping.

ROAD REPORT: Zimmerman read off report. He stated the road milling is completed in the Heights and Altamont areas. Brush hog has been ordered for early next month. Darlene Kubulis, Shenandoah Heights, a pothole on Schuylkill Ave that needs to be addressed. Martin stated that he will contact PennDot for this to be addressed.

Motion to approve all reports was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

CORRESPONDENCE: none

OLD BUSINESS: Chair asked for a motion to hire Zach Kropp as summer seasonal employee retroactive to June 2 at a rate of \$12.00 per hour. Motion to approve was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes. Chair added that the township will have another summer help employee funded entirely by the OVR program starting 6/22/26.

Chair asked for a motion to approve Resolution 2026-5, price adjustment resolution for bituminous materials. Motion to approve was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

Chair asked for a motion to advertise Ordinance 2026-1, amendment to ordinance 1995-3 regarding parking restrictions. Motion to approve was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes. Kropp discussed the ordinance and mentioned that there is a 72-hour parking rule that will be enforced upon adoption.

NEW BUSINESS: Chair announced that seal bids for the 2026 road project were open today at noon by Michalik and Zimmerman. Michalik announced that there was only one bid received and that was from Lehigh Asphalt Paving at a cost of \$140, 433.14 for the entire base bid. Motion to award the project to Lehigh Asphalt Paving was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.

PUBLIC: Charles Lawson, Schuylkill Ave, complained to the Board about parking tickets that should be issued in his neighborhood. Kubilus added that people parking in the wrong direction of traffic should also be cited. Both complaints were issues ongoing on Schuylkill Avenue.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:25 p.m. Motion was made by Kayes, seconded by Gladski, with all three voting yes.
