

ORDINANCE 95-3
PARKING ORDINANCE FOR WEST MAHANoy TOWNSHIP

SECTION 101

The Sections of this Ordinance shall supersede and/or replace any sections of Ordinances previously enacted which specifically discuss, relate to or deal with parking and/or the operations of motor vehicles in the areas designated in the following sections set forth herein.

SECTION 102 - STREETS WHERE PARKING IS PROHIBITED

A. Parking shall be prohibited at all times in the following locations:

SHENANDOAH HEIGHTS

- (a) For the north side of Schuylkill Avenue beginning at the intersection of Pennsylvania Avenue and continuing to the intersection with Ringtown Road;
- (b) For the east side of Swatara Road beginning at the intersection with Schuylkill Avenue and continuing to the end of Swatara Road;
- (c) For both sides of Norton Way beginning at the intersection with Schuylkill Avenue and continuing to Wyoming Avenue;
- (d) For the west side of Ringtown Road beginning at the intersection with Pennsylvania Avenue and continuing to Schuylkill Avenue;
- (e) For the south side of Indiana Avenue beginning at the intersection of Wyoming Avenue and continuing to Seneca Street;
- (f) For the north side of Arizona Avenue beginning at the intersection with Swatara Road and continuing to the intersection at Seneca Street;
- (g) For both sides of Pennsylvania Avenue beginning at State Route 924 and continuing to the intersection with Schuylkill Avenue;

- (h) For both sides of Pennsylvania Avenue beginning at the intersection with Ringtown Road and continuing to the intersection with West and Plain;
- (i) For the entire south side of High Road West;
- (j) For the east side of Norton Way beginning at the intersection with Schuylkill Avenue and continuing to Indiana Avenue;

ALTAMONT (FRACKVILLE)

- (a) For the north side of Oak Street beginning at the intersection with Line Street and continuing to the intersection with Spencer Street;
- (b) For both sides of Line Street beginning at the intersection with Spring Street and continuing to the end of Line Street;
- (c) For both sides of Line Street beginning at the intersection with Fine Street and continuing to the Industrial Park Road;
- (d) For the west side of Lotus Alley beginning at the intersection with Fine Street and continuing to Spring Street;
- (e) For the west side of Back Alley beginning at the intersection with Willow Street and continuing to Frack Street;
- (f) For the east side of Fir Alley beginning at the intersection with Willow Street and continuing to Morea Road;
- (g) For both sides of Bacon Avenue beginning at the intersection with the Altamont Blvd. and continuing to Garfield Avenue;
- (h) For both sides of Garfield Avenue beginning at the intersection with Bacon Avenue and continuing to Spring Street.

WILLIAM PENN, LOST CREEK AND BROWNSVILLE

- (a) For both sides of State Route 54 within the West Mahanoy Township;
- (b) For both sides of State Route 4031 from the intersection with State Route 54 in William Penn to the intersection of State Route 4032 in the Village of Raven Run;
- (c) For both sides of State Route 4032 from the intersection of State Route 4031, in the Village of Raven Run to the intersection of Schuylkill Avenue in Shenandoah Heights;
- (d) For both sides of Franklin Street beginning at the intersection of State Route 54 which has been designated as Main Street and continuing to the intersection of Back Street;
- (e) For the west side of Franklin Street in lower William Penn beginning at the intersection of State Route 54 and continuing south for a distance of 250 feet.

B. Any person who violates a provision of this Section shall be issued a citation for \$10.00. If the citation is not paid within 5 days, additional costs will be assessed for the prosecution of this matter

SECTION 103 - STREETS CONTAINING RESTRICTIVE PARKING.

A. Parking shall be prohibited at all times at the following locations for the respective streets:

SHENANDOAH HEIGHTS

- (a) On both sides of Schuylkill Avenue beginning at the intersection with Swatara Road and extending 40 feet in a northward direction;
- (b) On both sides of Ohio Avenue beginning at the intersection with Swatara Road and extending 40 feet in an eastward direction;
- (c) On both sides of Indiana Avenue beginning at the intersection with Swatara Road and extending 40 feet in an eastward direction;

- (d) On both sides of Florida Avenue beginning at the intersection with Swatara Road and extending 40 feet in an eastward direction;
- (e) On both sides of Virginia Avenue beginning at its intersection with Swatara Road and extending 40 feet in an eastward direction;
- (f) On both sides of Arizona Avenue beginning at its intersection with Swatara Road and extending 40 feet in an eastward direction;
- (g) On both sides of California Avenue beginning at its intersection with Swatara Road and extending 40 feet in an eastward direction;
- (h) On the south side of Schuylkill Avenue beginning at its intersection with Ringtown Road and extending 40 feet in an eastward direction;
- (i) On the east side of Ringtown Road starting at its intersection with Schuylkill Avenue and extending 40 feet in a southward direction;
- (j) On the east side of Ringtown Road beginning at its intersection with Pennsylvania Avenue and extending 40 feet in a northward direction;
- (k) On the west side of Swatara Road beginning at its intersection with Schuylkill Avenue and extending 40 feet in a southward direction;
- (l) On both sides of Seneca Road beginning at its intersection with Virginia Avenue and extending 40 feet in both a northward and southward direction.
- (m) On the south side of Schuylkill Avenue beginning at its intersection with Pennsylvania Avenue extending 65 feet in a westward direction;

ALTAMONT

- (a) On the south side of Oak Street beginning at its intersection with Line Street and continuing 40 feet in a southward direction;

- (b) On the south side of Ohio Avenue beginning at its intersection with Norton Way 40 feet in an eastward direction;
- (c) On the south side of Schuylkill Avenue beginning at its intersection with Ringtown Road 80 feet in an eastward direction;
- (d) On the south side of Oak Street beginning at the intersection with Line Street and continuing 40 feet in an eastward direction.

B. Any person who violates a provision of this Section shall be issued a citation for \$10.00. If the citation is not paid within 5 days, the additional cost will be assessed in the prosecution of the offense.

SECTION 104 - RESTRICTIONS ON PARKING OF TRUCKS, BUSES AND SPECIFIED OTHER VEHICLES

A. It shall be unlawful for any person to park on any street, except in designated areas, the following types of vehicles:

- (a) Articulated bus;
- (b) Bus;
- (c) Combination vehicle;
- (d) Implement of husbandry;
- (e) Construction truck;
- (f) Farm equipment;
- (g) Farm vehicle;
- (h) Full trailer, wrecker, rollback;
- (i) House trailer;
- (j) Mass transit vehicle;
- (k) Mobile home;
- (l) Motor carrier vehicle;

- (m) Recreational vehicle;
- (n) Semi trailer;
- (o) Trailer;
- (p) Truck tractor.

B. The vehicles set forth in (A) may only be parked in designated areas. Designated areas is defined as follows:

- (a) A parking lot located at the intersection of Altamont and Industrial Park Road;
- (b) For a distance of 250 feet at the most Southern end of Line Street at its intersection with Industrial Road;
- (c) In the Frackville Industrial Park;
- (d) At the outskirts of the residential areas where the noise of the vehicles will not interfere with the flow of traffic or create noise and disturbance within the community.

C. It will be permissible to park a camping trailer, boat trailer or full trailer on Township streets for the purpose of loading and unloading equipment or household items. Unloading time for the purposes of this Section will not exceed 1 hour.

D. Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall be ordered to pay a fine of \$50.00.

SECTION 105 - TEMPORARY EMERGENCY PARKING REGULATIONS

A. The Board of Supervisors and Police Department shall have the power to regulate traffic and parking in cases of emergency for the health and safety and welfare of its citizens.

B. An emergency under this Section will be defined as any situation which the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the Township is deemed at issue which includes but is not limited to the following:

- (a) In the case of a fire, flood, storm or other emergency to establish temporary traffic and/or parking regulations;

- (b) In the case of emergency or to facilitate public works, or in the conduct of parades, precessions or public events, to restrict or prohibit traffic and/or parking in limited areas;
- (c) The Board of Supervisors will have the authority to close any street to vehicle traffic and to place barriers or station police officers at each end of the closed portion, while construction or maintenance work is underway or a special event is being conducted on the closed portion;
- (d) The Board of Supervisors shall have the authority to establish restricted traffic area upon any street where the construction or maintenance work is underway and to station flagmen at the end of the restricted portion.

C. Any person who fails to abide by the temporary and emergency regulations established by the police shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$25.00 and costs.

SECTION 106 - EXPERIMENTAL REGULATIONS

A. The Board of Supervisors and Police department may from time to time for the health, safety and welfare of its citizens designate sections upon and along the highways of the Township where, for a period of not more than 90 days, specific parking regulations, prohibitions and restrictions shall be enforced and shall designate such locations by proper signs and markings. The purpose of this Section is to allow for the test and experimental determinations of the feasibility and desirability of permanent changes in the Ordinance of the Township relative to traffic and parking.

B. Any person who violates this Section shall be sentenced to pay a fine of \$25.00 and costs.

SECTION 107 - PARKING IN THE FOLLOWING MANNER IS PROHIBITED

A. No person shall park or stop for purposes other than obeying traffic signals in the following manner:

- (a) Park within an intersection;

- (b) Double park;
- (c) Park in a way which would obstruct traffic;
- (d) Park on railway tracks;
- (e) Park on any sidewalks within the township;
- (f) Park in front of public or private driveways;
- (g) Park within 15 feet of a fire hydrant;
- (h) Park within 30 feet of any stop sign, yield sign, intersection or traffic control signal;
- (i) Park at any place where signs prohibit parking.

B. Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$15.00 and costs.

SECTION 108 - AUTHORITY OF POLICE OFFICERS

A. The Police officers of West Mahanoy Township are hereby authorized to direct traffic on the highways of West Mahanoy Township and at intersections thereof, and to otherwise enforce the provision of this Ordinance.

This Ordinance shall become effective the 21st day of
November , 1995.
